# What Sets Us Apart



## ONE GOAL

- Our goal is to support Baluchon's long-term respite care services. A homegrown Quebec innovation, Baluchon is a trusted and well-established organization that provides essential in-home respite care and support services to families caring for a loved one with declining independence.

## ADDRESSING THE GEOGRAPHICAL CHALLENGE

- Thanks to our support, long-term in-home respite care is becoming more accessible, allowing us to reach families across all of Quebec, not just in major urban centres.
- Our respite care workers have travelled 264,000 km throughout Quebec, enough to circle the Earth seven times!

## A BUFFER AGAINST INFLATION

- Cost to families per day of respite care in 2008: \$15. Cost to families per day of respite care in 2025: \$15. The Foundation helps keep respite care affordable while ensuring the highest standards of care are maintained.

## A DIVERSE CLIENT BASE

- Not so long ago, Baluchon focused primarily on Alzheimer's disease. Thanks to our support, the expansion of Baluchon's services has been a resounding success. Today, it enables the organization to offer this invaluable support to other family caregivers, particularly those caring for someone with a disability or a chronic or degenerative illness.

# Highlights

## A RECORD YEAR

Once again this year, thanks to the extraordinary commitment of our donors, volunteers, and supporters, we exceeded our initial fundraising goals. We are especially proud to close the fiscal year with \$898,000 in philanthropic revenue.

Even more importantly, this marks our sixth consecutive year of growth in philanthropic revenue, reinforcing the strong momentum we have built over the years. It is a powerful reflection of the trust and confidence our donors and partners continue to place in our Foundation.

## A NEW WAY TO GIVE: GIFTS OF SECURITIES

The Foundation can now accept gifts of publicly traded securities, an increasingly popular charitable giving option within the business and philanthropic communities. This new opportunity was made possible thanks to the expertise of Board member François Gauvin, CPA.

Working closely with our Director of Finance, Mr. Gauvin guided the establishment of the investment account required to receive these gifts. His contribution did not stop there. He also became the Foundation's first donor to make a gift of publicly traded securities, helping launch what promises to become an important source of philanthropic support.

To introduce this new giving option, we are also developing a range of communication tools, including a short informational video for current and prospective donors. Our goal is to explain, in clear and accessible terms, the financial and tax advantages of donating publicly traded securities.

### Benefits of Donating Publicly Traded Securities for Donors

- No capital gains tax: Pay no tax on the capital gain when donating publicly traded securities.
- Charitable tax receipt: Receive a tax receipt for the full fair market value of the securities at the time of the gift.
- Greater tax savings: Benefit from both the charitable tax credit and the elimination of capital gains tax.
- For business owners: A gift of securities may allow funds to be distributed tax-efficiently through the Capital Dividend Account (CDA).\*

### Benefits for the Nonprofit

- Full value of the gift: Receives 100% of the value of the donated securities.
- Immediate access to funds: Securities can be sold immediately, allowing the organization to put the funds to work without delay.
- Larger gifts: Donors are often able to make more generous gifts than they would with cash alone.
- New donor opportunities: Helps attract investors and major donors.

## LONG-TERM FINANCIAL RESERVE AND INTEREST INCOME

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This year, the Foundation reached an important milestone by establishing a long-term financial reserve. Designed to provide Baluchon with a financial safety net, this reserve will help strengthen the organization's long-term financial stability.

The strategy is already beginning to pay dividends. The reserve is generating interest income, creating a new and reliable source of funding that will allow us to expand our long-term impact and provide even more hours of in-home respite care to families across Quebec.

Because philanthropic revenue can fluctuate and government funding is sometimes delayed by as much as six months, maintaining a financial reserve gives us immediate access to funds when they are needed most. In fact, we had to draw on it at the very end of the fiscal year when funding for respite days ran out.

## MAPLE: A NEW TELEMEDICINE SERVICE FOR ALL OUR EMPLOYEES

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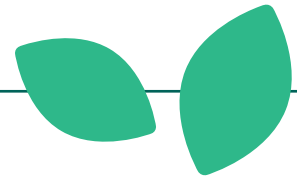
Baluchon now benefits from a unique philanthropic initiative that supports the health and well-being of our respite care workers, who spend so much of their time caring for others. Thanks to Véronique Joubert, a member of the Foundation's Board of Directors, and her team at Unixia, all Baluchon employees now have free access to the Maple virtual healthcare platform.

Recognizing that the limited budgets of nonprofit organizations often make comprehensive employee benefits out of reach, Véronique took action to support our team's well-being. Because traditional benefits plans were beyond our means, she approached several providers before securing a no-cost partnership with Maple, a Canadian virtual healthcare company.

This donation is fully aligned with our mission: to provide our employees with quick and easy access to healthcare services, enabling them to take care of themselves so they can continue their essential work.

This gesture of recognition and goodwill not only underscores our board members' commitment to the long-term sustainability of our organization, but it also strengthens our organizational culture, one where the well-being of our employees remains a priority.

We focus most of our fundraising and solicitation efforts on large private foundations and major corporations in Quebec and, to a lesser extent, across Canada. This strategic choice is based on a clear operational observation: the ratio between time invested and the amount of donations received is significantly more favourable in these cases. With only one full-time employee, this approach has proven to be the most productive.

Nevertheless, we recognize the importance of diversifying our revenue streams to ensure the continuity of our respite services. This is why, thanks to the invaluable support of the Mirella and Lino Saputo Foundation, we have partnered with the Plan Humain agency to develop our next fundraising action plan.

## FOUNDATION ACTION PLAN

We identified more than 30 concrete initiatives, several of which have already been implemented. We are already seeing encouraging early results. Building on this momentum, we plan to accelerate our efforts in the coming months to further diversify our revenue streams.

## THE PRIVILEGE OF LONG-STANDING RELATIONSHIPS

We are fortunate to have the enduring support of a number of long-standing philanthropic partners. Their exceptional loyalty is the foundation of our work and deserves special recognition. We would also like to extend our heartfelt thanks to the foundations and individual donors, whose generous and ongoing support enables us to expand access to respite care for a growing number of family caregivers.

## BUILDING NEW RELATIONSHIPS

This year was also marked by the involvement of new financial partners, particularly within the English-speaking community. This support was made possible because of, among other things, the complete translation of our website and all our supporting documents. This milestone has opened new doors for us, making it easier to engage with a broader pool of donors from the English-speaking corporate and philanthropic sectors.

The contribution from the Philantra Foundation is also particularly significant, not only because it is a new source of funding but also because the foundation manages several endowment funds, which bodes well for future opportunities.

We were also involved with the Montreal Jewish Foundation, which has a similar structure.

These new successes confirm the effectiveness of our outreach efforts and strengthen our ability to support Baluchon's mission with an increasingly diverse range of partners.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to Dahlia Tellier for giving these women the opportunity to care for themselves after spending the year so selflessly caring for others.



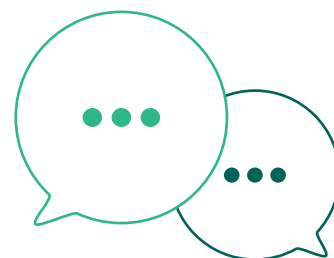

# Communications



## NEWSLETTER

*L'Entraide*, our twice-yearly newsletter, is a cornerstone of our communications strategy. Published each spring and fall, it serves as an essential link between Baluchon, our members, the families we serve, and our valued donors across Quebec.

Last fall's edition was especially noteworthy. We introduced several new features and gave readers a behind-the-scenes look at the organization, offering fresh insight into the people, stories, and work that bring Baluchon's mission to life.

- **Governance and Engagement:** For the first time, we introduced the members of Baluchon's Board of Directors. Putting a face to our governance helps build trust in the organization's management.
- **Rigorous Recruitment and the Profile of a Respite Care Worker:** We detailed our rigorous method for recruiting respite care workers, a selective process that guarantees the quality of care and safety in the home. This section was complemented by a profile of a respite care worker, providing a concrete example of the dedication and expertise required to provide high-quality, long-term respite care.

This commitment to transparency and authentic storytelling proved its value. The newsletter inspired an outpouring of spontaneous generosity, with donations from individual supporters increasing following its distribution. The response confirmed that sharing the human stories behind our mission, while showcasing the professionalism of our work, is a powerful way to inspire engagement and support.



## SOCIAL MEDIA

**LinkedIn:** Our community remains stable at 119 followers. The implementation of our action plan and the production of short video clips will provide an opportunity to revitalize the Foundation's social media presence.

**Facebook:** Our Facebook community remains steady at 579 followers. As with Baluchon's broader community, our audience reflects the realities of family caregiving: 75% women and 25% men. Most of our followers are based in Canada (83%), followed by France (12%) and Belgium (2%), mirroring the countries where Baluchon and its model are established.

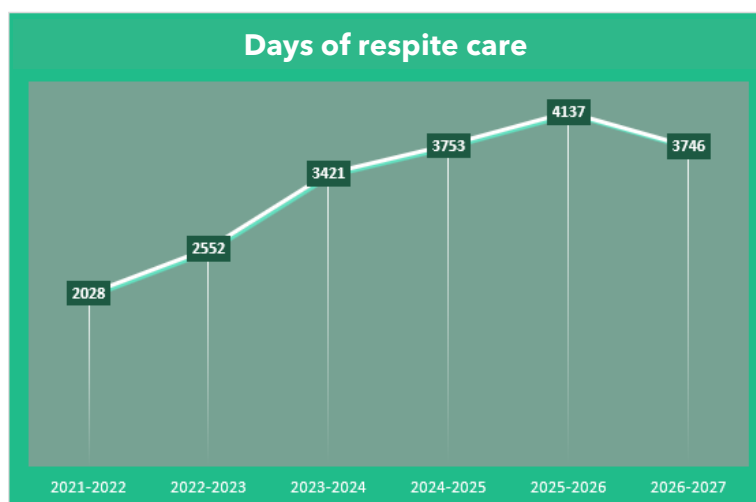
It was a valuable opportunity to:

# Annual Report

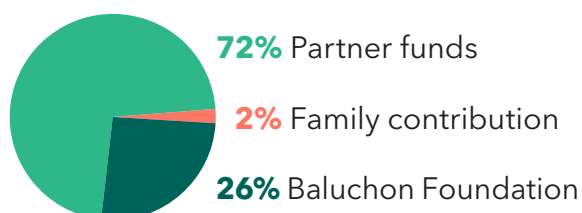

Despite the Foundation's strong performance, government funding alone was not sufficient to meet demand at the end of the 2025-2026 fiscal year, leaving many families served by certain CISSSs and CIUSSSs waiting for respite care.

This is where the Foundation's role, and the generosity of our philanthropic partners, proved indispensable. Thanks to a rapid mobilization and critical additional donations, we were able to honour the vast majority of the respite days that had already been confirmed. We extend our heartfelt thanks to the Grace Dart Foundation, whose exceptional support ensured that respite services throughout Greater Montreal continued uninterrupted throughout the month of March.

Looking ahead, with no increase in government funding anticipated next year, Baluchon will have no choice but to reduce its service capacity. The number of respite care days is expected to decline slightly in 2026-2027 as a result of frozen government funding and rising inflation. The Foundation will therefore need to continue growing and increase its share of the funding for respite days in order to limit this decline. As a result, the Foundation will cover 26% of the cost of every day of Baluchon respite care in 2026-2027.

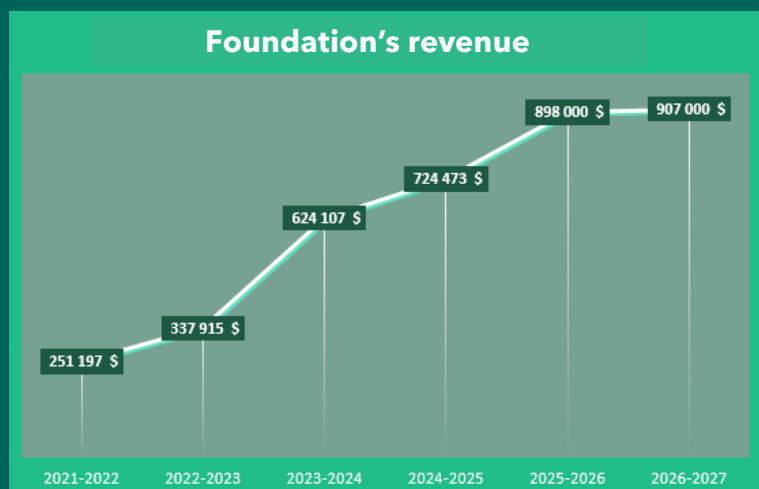
## Grants per respite care day

# Foundation Outlook

The Foundation's revenue has increased sixfold since 2021, which is excellent news.

Financial resources are essential to fulfilling our mission. That is why we have set an **ambitious fundraising goal** for 2026-2027: to surpass the \$900,000 mark.

This symbolic milestone is essential to ensuring the long-term sustainability of our mission. For every day of respite care, the Foundation covers a portion of the cost to ease the financial burden on families and caregivers.

For the coming year, our strategic vision is centred on a clear objective: to build a solid financial foundation capable of safeguarding our mission, regardless of external fluctuations.

We are currently at a pivotal moment as we transition between two government action plans for family caregiving. This period has created genuine uncertainty around the renewal and timing of public funding.

In this context, the Foundation must continue to demonstrate agility and foresight to ensure there is no interruption in the services families depend on. We cannot allow administrative uncertainty to compromise the respite that family caregivers so urgently need.
