INVESTMENT COMMITTEE TO SUPPORT BALUCHON IN THE LONG TERM

To ensure the financial sustainability of Baluchon and its Foundation, an investment committee has been established.

Its goal is to prudently manage a portion of the Foundation's funds in order to generate additional income through interest. These returns will help increase our financial resources and, in turn, expand our impact and allow us to offer more services to those in need. A portion of the funds remains readily accessible, as the organization's cash flow may fluctuate due to the uncertainties of external funding.

The creation of this committee reflects not only sound and responsible financial management, but also the engagement and dynamism of our Board members. Their hands-on commitment demonstrates a shared desire to ensure the Foundation's long-term development and to actively contribute to the fulfillment of its mission.

VISIBILITY AND OUTREACH

Our Executive Director, Sophie Morin, covered a lot of ground last year. She travelled extensively to promote our services and raise awareness about our organization.

Outreach: donation requests

Supporting caregivers means not only making numerous donation requests, but also diligently following up with donors and foundations. Philanthropy remains a challenging field, and in Quebec, its growth has been slower than in other parts of the country. Reaching our ambitious goals requires sustained and strategic effort.

Public engagement

Since its inception, Baluchon has thrived on collaboration. In the early days, this was essential for survival: we needed to make ourselves known, and, above all, accepted. Twenty-five years later, with a strong reputation and solid foundation, the time has come to honour our mission by doing even more for caregivers. Public engagement allows us to build relationships with organizations and stakeholders who share our values and objectives.






Government relations

Whether engaging with Santé Québec, various ministers, or MNAs, Baluchon and its Foundation actively advocate not only for our mission, but also on behalf of caregivers across Quebec. As the province's population continues to age—a trend that will only accelerate in the coming years—we find ourselves at the heart of a major socio-economic challenge. It is essential that our voice be heard by elected officials and government representatives. Baluchon has taken part in several initiatives related to caregiving, including the development of the *Politique sur les soins et les services de soutien à domicile* (Policy on Home Care and Support Services), to which we contributed by submitting a formal brief.

A RECORD NUMBER OF RESPITE DAYS

With more than 3,700 respite days in 2024-25, we have nearly doubled our 2021-2022 total. This record in terms of our support services is directly linked to the Foundation's increased revenue. In other words, thanks to sound management, but above all thanks to our generous donors, we have been able to be even more present for caregivers throughout Quebec.

In line with our 2022-2025 Strategic Plan, we have increased our efforts to engage with businesses and private foundations. Corporate donations play a key role in advancing and sustaining our mission, offering the best return in terms of both time invested and funds raised.

By providing multi-year financial support, private foundations allow us to offer more respite days to more caregivers, while also enabling us to plan for future growth. These contributions go far beyond financial transactions; they reflect meaningful support and a deep commitment to the Foundation's values and goals.

The equation is simple: the more donations we receive, the more respite days Baluchon can offer. It's also worth highlighting our strong conversion rate again this year. Of the 23 funding requests submitted, 12 were approved and only 3 were declined, a clear sign that our major donor strategy is yielding results.

We still have eight requests pending, and if our current conversion rate holds, they could significantly advance our objectives.

DEPARTURE OF GHISLAINE LAROCQUE







AFFORDABLE RESPITE AT LES AUGUSTINES

Thanks to the support of the Baluch on Long-term Respite Care Foundation and key partnerships, respite care is offered at an exceptionally affordable rate. What's more, while we care for their loved ones, caregivers can enjoy a restful stay at the Monastère des Augustines in Old Quebec for just \$65 per night. The stay includes accommodations, three healthy meals, and a guided discussion session to reflect on their experience. Yoga activities are also available to help them recharge both body and mind.







Last Year and Review of Strategic Plan for 2022-2025

It is time to take stock of our 2022-2025 Strategic Plan. Developed at a pivotal moment for Baluch on. Just as we were emerging from a global pandemic, it responded to a mandate to broaden our service model. This ambitious expansion posed an unprecedented organizational challenge, one we had to confront under particularly difficult circumstances.

OUR USERS HAVE BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH OVER ONE HUNDRED DIFFERENT CONDITIONS

It may be hard to believe, even for those of us who have been with Baluchon for years, but not so long ago, our respite services were offered exclusively to families affected by Alzheimer's disease.

Now, as we enter the final year of our strategic plan, more than 100 health conditions are eligible for respite care, with a growing number related to degenerative illnesses. In addition to well-known neurocognitive disorders such as multiple sclerosis and various forms of dementia, we now support individuals living with much rarer conditions, including:

- Multiple system atrophy (MSA)
- Various forms of ataxia
- Corticobasal degeneration (CBD)
- Encephalopathy of various origins
- Huntington's disease
- All types of cerebral palsy
- Different forms of muscular dystrophy
- Neurological syndromes, often hereditary and affecting development, such as Angelman syndrome, Andermann syndrome, Ehlers-Danlos syndrome, Rett syndrome, Usher syndrome, cerebellar syndrome, and various types of encephalopathy.

We're talking about families who have never had a moment's rest, and caregivers who, through no fault of their own, often find themselves in limbo within the healthcare system. These are individuals who make tremendous sacrifices to ensure their loved ones have the best possible quality of life, yet far too often, they feel forgotten.

Thanks to our donors, Baluchon is now there for them. Our extraordinary volunteers have risen to the challenge, adapting their support to meet each family's unique needs.

The Foundation has played a key role in Baluchon's expansion. And this year, once again, caregivers will benefit from something they've long been denied: a little time for themselves, often for the first time in years, or even decades.

OUR GOALS SURPASSED

Our objectives have not only been achieved; they've been surpassed. This success is the result of the unwavering dedication of our teams, the steadfast support of our partners, and the strong engagement of the members of our two Boards of Directors. Together, we've gone beyond our initial goals and laid a solid foundation for the future.



Outlook for 2025

The Foundation will face several challenges in the coming months. To begin with, we will need to recruit a new board member. The process is already underway, and we hope to welcome a talented new addition to our team in the first half of the fiscal year.

Baluchon's growth also presents a significant challenge in itself. While this is a "good" problem to have, 2026 will be a pivotal year for our ability to provide more respite days as demand continues to rise. There is a real risk of reaching capacity, and we will work hard to avoid such a scenario.

We have two pieces of good news that will help support us in this effort. First, we will receive a significant increase in funding from the MSSS for 2025-2026, which will allow us to better meet growing demand.

However, relying solely on the ministère de la Santé (Ministry of Health) to sustain our growth would be a mistake. The Foundation must play its part. The second piece of good news is the formation of the investment committee, which aims to provide Baluchon with a financial cushion.

Stable funding and cash flow will be key priorities this year. Dialogue will continue between Baluch on and its Foundation, as well as with our 16 partners, to work toward some form of long-term funding, an essential factor in supporting our work and planning. With the team in place and discussions underway, we are confident we will find innovative and bold solutions to reach our goals.
